<b>Relevance</b>	The topic is not relevant to the conference theme, academic librarians, or libraries. The topic is too narrow or broad. <b>Appeal</b>	The proposal does not provide new information and/or is an overdone or old topic and/or would not appeal to academic librarians.	The proposal provides new information on a current or trending topic but not in an innovative way or would not appeal to academic librarians.	The proposal clearly explores a current or trending topic in an innovative way and would appeal to academic librarians.

**Fit:** The proposal seems like a good fit for the type of session selected (45-minute session, lightning talk, poster session, round table session), such as the amount of time needed to cover the topic or discussion effectively.

**Clarity:** The learning outcomes and goals of the presentation are clear, cohesive, and realistic.

**Relevance:** The topic is relevant to the conference theme, or academic librarians and libraries, and is not too narrow or broad.

**Appeal:** The topic is being explored in an innovative or new way that would appeal to audience members (academic librarians).
